



WEBSPY PRODUCTS INCLUDED IN MICROSOFT'S SECURITY SERVER

Western Australian software developer WebSpy has broken new ground by entering a close alliance with Microsoft and integrating its WebSpy Analyzer Internet Monitoring tool with Microsoft's internet firewall and Web Cache server, for which Web Spy's software is a useful complement. "One area ISA doesn't cover extensively is reporting Internet usage," noted Jack Andrys, CEO of WebSpy.

Andrys said that the agreement with Microsoft includes a royalty exchange when either company or a partner sells the other's product. WebSpy has already begun distributing the integrated products worldwide through its offices in Australia, the US and London.

The benefits of the agreement to WebSpy include the local developer's association with the world wide market leader, increased revenue opportunities, and the chance to accelerate development of new technology through further software integration, Andrys added.

The agreement also gives WebSpy the right to continue to work on further integration of its products with Microsoft's server, which Andrys believes is a considerable benefit and will ultimately lead to the integration of all WebSpy products with ISA. "Security products will continue to be consolidated into more comprehensive packages for users. The aim is to simplify security," he said. www.webspy.com
