



## Every click you make, they'll be watching you

If you're web-surfing at work, beware: WA-based WebSpy will release Wednesday an application which enables small to medium business owners to create detailed reports on employee Internet usage patterns.

According to Jack Andrys, WebSpy CEO, Web Spy Analyzer, which joins existing products WebSpy Reporter and WebSpy Sentinel, will fill a gap currently left in Internet reporting tools.

"The small to medium enterprise market is largely ignored by much of WebSpy's competition, who choose to target much larger clients, and this places Analyzer in a unique position to capture market share in this sector very quickly," said Andrys.

WebSpy Analyzer collects its data by interrogating the data contained in log files generated by third party solutions such as proxy servers or firewalls, allowing the user to either navigate through the information or create reports within predefined parameters.

Chris Johnston, WebSpy Operations Manager told iTNews that pre-release interest in WebSpy Analyzer has been great, with many pre-orders coming from government departments.

Pricing of the new product could not be revealed, but Johnston said that it will be sub-\$900 for an unlimited user base within individual businesses.

Following the release of WebSpy Analyzer, the company is expecting to announce the appointment of several major distribution partners in key markets around the world.
